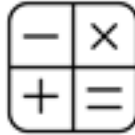


Maths

- **Place Value:** read, write, order and compare numbers up to 20 then to 50.
- **Addition and Subtraction:** The children will add and subtract one digit and two digit numbers up to 20 including 0. Represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20. Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.
- **Measurement: weight and volume:** The children will compare, describe and solve practical problems for mass/weight and Measure and record mass/weight.

Reasoning and Problem Solving in all of the areas above.



Wider Curriculum

- **History:** Year 1 children will study space. Looking at Neil Armstrong and his significance.
- **Geography:** The children will study the United Kingdom; naming the four countries of the UK, capital cities and the surrounding seas.
- **DT:** In D and T, Year 1 will be taught the knowledge, understanding and skills needed to make a moving picture using mechanisms.
- **Art:** In art, the children will be exploring sculpture and using texture to make a rocket.
- **Music:** Our unit 'in the groove' a song used to teach the children about different styles of music. The children will explore six different styles; Blues, Baroque, Latin, Bhangra, Folk and Funk. They will develop the children's ability to listen and appraise, improvise and compose their very own track.



Year 1

Spring Term Overview

Science

'Everyday Materials' - Exploring 'Everyday Materials' is the first part of two units. In this unit the children learn how to distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made. They also learn how to identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water and rock. They describe the simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials. And finally, they learn how to compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties.

PE

During the Spring term pupils will work closely with NUFC coaches to develop their throwing and catching skills.

The children will also be developing their striking and fielding skills.



English

- **Writing:** This term the children will develop their grammar, punctuation and spelling skills. Year 1 has a significant focus on sentence structure, which will be developed in their writing of genres such as narrative with repeating patterns and stories from familiar settings.



- **Spelling:** Children will use their phonic knowledge to spell words including as common exception words.
- **Reading:** In reading lessons, children will demonstrate a pleasure in reading, to listen whilst others read to them and show understanding by joining in discussions about the text. They will recognise and join in with repetitive refrains in the text.

PSHE
